





by politics is meant such action as that taken by the German and Swiss Colonists of Santa Fé, but we understand that this is a participation in sedition rather than in legitimate politics. No one can condemn such action in too strong terms, for it is inexcusable in foreigners who have not become naturalized and exhausted all legal and peaceable means for obtaining justice and good government, which those in question or illustration have not done. In order to understand the legitimate relation of foreigners to politics, it will be well to recur to the legitimate meaning of the word and the scope of the subject or science. Politics consists of the science of Government. Who are interested in good government? The answer to this question will indicate the legitimate sphere of interest and influence in political discussion and consideration. We can conceive no greater interest on the part of an Argentine than of a foreign-born resident. The mere fact of a difference in birth-place in no way changes the interests which we have in the character and the conduct of the Government under which we live. Most of us were not consulted as to any preference we might have in a birth-place; indeed, the latter fact was controlled by other volition than our own, even though we may fully acquiesce in the fact, but living as we do, native and foreign-born, under the same Government, laws and conditions, we have an equal interest that the aforesaid Government should be wise, strong, just and efficient. But it is urged that unnaturalized foreigners should not participate in politics and that in case one wishes to meddle therewith he should become naturalized. Undoubtedly, naturalization is the ideal policy for those who come here to make a new home, but those who are here for a term of years and hope to return to their native land at some time, have, while here, an equal interest with Argentines in all that makes for good government. Even those who are here to remain but who do not care to sever their relations to their native land have all the interests and all the rights of the Argentine with the exception of the voting franchise and its logical sequence, the eligibility for office. These latter are rights inherent in citizenship, while the discussion of politics is not. This difference is clearly maintained in the Constitution and the laws, and it is in harmony with facts and the fitness of things.

Constitutional law does not prohibit but specially recognizes, in the plainest of language, the equality of all residents in the Republic, and all the rights for which we contend both by the organic law and by international treaties made under the Constitution. Good taste does not require us to abstain from what the Constitution confers upon us, for no Argentine enjoys any right or privilege which does not rest upon the same authority. Inquiries for office, in partisan-scheming, in scrambles for power, in conspiracies for the overthrow of Governments and parties by seditious means, the foreigner has no right to participate, but neither has the native-born Argentine, so that, whatever the analogies followed out, they bring us at last to the point that, with the exception of giving a vote or holding an office, we have, whether born foreigners or Argentines, equal rights by the law of the Republic, by the rule of self and mutual interest, by the laws of good taste and the dictates of sound statesmanship.

We make no apology for discussing all public questions as freely, as fully, and as boldly as it had been born in this Republic. It is only fair to say that, with but few exceptions, this view has been recognised by our Argentine colleagues, and they show no special respect for a foreign colony, man or paper that cares only for money-grubbing.

## LONDON NOTES

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 1.

In the House of Lords yesterday the question of betterment was again discussed, in connection with the London Improvement Bill. Lord Hobhouse moved that the view of their lordships against betterment should not be insisted upon, the other House having reinstated the provision in the Bill which the Committee had struck out in consequence of the resolution passed by the Lords. The motion was supported by Lord Monckswell, the Earl of Kimberley, and the Lord Chancellor, and was opposed by the Earl of Onslow, the Marquis of Salisbury, the Earl of Morley, and the Earl of Wemyss; and on a division it was rejected by 60 to 27.

In the House of Commons, questions were put to the Under-Secretary for Foreign Affairs with regard to Siam and the New Hebrides. In the course of replying on the former subject, Sir E. Grey said that there had been no withdrawal of the assurances given by France with respect to the independence of Siam, and that Lord Dufferin was returning to Paris this week to resume the negotiations on the lines previously agreed upon with the French Government, and stated in the House, as necessary to safeguard British interests. As to the New Hebrides, Sir E. Grey said that annexation by France could not take place without the present convention being terminated; no notice had been given to terminate it, and her Majesty's Government had no information which would justify them in thinking that the French Government for a moment contemplated such a step. Mr. Gladstone gave notice of a resolution to be moved on Monday with regard to the business of the House, and stated that the Government had determined at the close of Supply to advise the House to adjourn till the

2nd of November for the purpose of then finishing the business of the session. This statement was received with loud and prolonged Ministerial cheers. The debate on the third reading of the Home Rule Bill and the amendment by Mr. Tritt, who completed the speech begun on Wednesday, and he was followed by the Attorney-General; among other members taking part in the debate being Mr. Plunket, Mr. E. J. Morton, Mr. Dillon, Sir H. James, and Mr. Justin McCarthy, who was speaking when the debate stood adjourned. The Naval Defence Amendment Bill was read a second time.

Mr. Asquith addressed a large and enthusiastic gathering yesterday afternoon at Althorp Park, Northamptonshire. Mr. C. R. Spencer presided over the meeting. The Home Secretary spoke upon the Home Rule Bill which, he said, did not contain a single topic of even secondary importance which had not been abundantly discussed at one stage or another. The talk about lack of opportunity of discussion he pronounced to be a cant. Referring to the expected rejection of the measure by the House of Lords, the right hon. gentleman said the Government would certainly not appeal to the country for such a reason. The intention of the Opposition to obstruct Supply in order to prevent the passage of British measures he termed political blackmailing, and said the Government meant to defeat such a plan of campaign.

A correspondent at the military manoeuvres dwells on the excellent staying power displayed by the men, in spite of the heavy marching which they have lately undergone.

A correspondent at Cardiff telegraphs that sixty thousand colliers were at work in South Wales and Monmouthshire yesterday, leaving forty thousand still out. He describes the serious effect of the strike upon the trade of the district, and gives an account of the revival of operations in various industries. At one or two places in Derbyshire yesterday there were disturbances between the strikers on the one hand and the workers and the police on the other. In accordance with the resolution of the coal merchants on Wednesday prices were raised a shilling a ton in London yesterday, and the opinion was expressed that there would be no fall this year, winter quotations probably ruling when the strike ceases.

The reported case of cholera at Grimsby has turned out really to be one of Asiatic cholera, that being the report by Dr. Klein, of St. Bartholomew's Hospital, after a bacteriological examination. By an arrangement made with the Local Government Board and the Commissioners of Inland Revenue, the Port of London Sanitary authority now has full power to board, examine, and detain ships on which suspicious cases of illness have been found.

On the resumption of the Silver debate in the United States Senate yesterday, Mr. Walcott, of Colorado, made an important speech in favour of silver. He declared that the Repeal party could attain their object more speedily by coupling with the repeal some provision for the use of silver as money. Without this it would be a long time before the law was repealed.

A telegram from Savannah states that the steamer City of Birmingham has arrived there with the crew of the City of Savannah, which was totally wrecked in the great cyclone. Reports of the tremendous damage done continue to reach Savannah from the whole of the coast from Wilmington, North Carolina, to Titusville, Florida. It is believed that two hundred lives have been lost. The United States war vessels Kearsarge and Nantucket have arrived safely in Hampton Roads.

The Australian cricketers met Notts yesterday at Nottingham, The Australians went in first, and made 215 runs for five wickets, At Scarborough, a match, the commencement of which was retarded by rain, was begun between Yorkshire and the South of England. The Yorkshire team made 226, and at the close of the day the South had made 90 without the loss of a wicket.

A singular case came before Sir John Bridge yesterday at the Bow-street Police-court. Mr. Dodd, a medical gentleman, of Harley-street, was charged with having assaulted Mr. Sturt, who holds an appointment at the India Office. It appeared that the complainant on stepping out of a lift at the Civil Service Stores in Bedford-street found some ladies and the defendant waiting to enter; and he stood in front of the lift so as to enable the ladies to enter before the defendant, who, being angry, assaulted him. Sir John Bridge held that it was the duty of a gentleman to allow ladies to go first, and he fined the defendant 5/- and costs. Defendant's solicitor said there would be an appeal.

Mr. Alfred Monson was brought up yesterday before the Sheriff at Livery Court House on a charge of having caused the death of Lieut. Hamborough, and was remanded in custody for a week.

## TO "LICK" THE LICK OBSERVATORY.

THE LARGEST TELESCOPE IN THE WORLD.

An observatory is being built for Mr. Yerkes, of Chicago, which will eclipse the Lick Observatory in having the largest telescope in existence. Cost is to be no consideration as long as the observatory becomes the largest in existence. With this view the new observatory is to have a refractor 40 in. in diameter, that of the Lick Observatory being only 36 in. The lens is now being made by Mr. A. Clark, Washington, while the supporting column and telescope are being constructed by Messrs. Warner and Swasey, Cleveland, Ohio. The column will have a height of 30 ft., and will weigh 45 tons. Upon it the steel polar axis, 13 ft. long, and weighing 3 1/2 tons, is mounted, and upon this, again, the declination axis, 11 ft. in diameter, and weighing 1 3/4 tons. The latter supports the telescope, which has a length of 59 ft., and a maximum diameter of 4 ft., and weighs 6 tons. Although the total weight of the telescope and its counter counter weights is 75 tons, the instrument may be brought into any position by a slight pressure. Some idea may be formed of the height of the observatory when it is stated that, the refractor is pointed to the zenith, the centre of the objective is 69 ft. above the earth's surface.

### The Hombage Burglary.

(A SHORT STORY.)

(Conclusion.)

The woman's statement as to the time on Tuesday afternoon was fatal to the theory which had begun to form in my brain, for the simple reason that Glynn Vaughan's train left King's Cross at a quarter past four. I confess I was fairly beaten. The gleam of light which the meeting with Mervyn Hawke produced had vanished, and left me in total darkness.

At it happened, my feelings of despair were rapidly chased away, and in this wise. The next night, shortly after twelve o'clock, as I was passing through Church Street, a quiet thoroughfare in the East, I noticed a man lying helpless on the pavement. Concluding he was drunk, I called a constable, and had him removed to the station. Several hours elapsed before he came round thoroughly, and then the story he had to relate was a remarkably strange one, though brief. He remembered dining at his club on the Monday evening, where he must have drunk a great deal of wine, for on turning out into the fresh air he felt quite dazed and silly. He also had a hazy notion of being placed in a cab; but his first real consciousness was finding himself in bed in a small, low-roofed room, with a heavily-shuttered window, and a total stranger by his side.

Slightly alarmed, he made an effort to rise, but was ordered to lie still, until he had heard what his companion had to say. Then this man informed him that he was in an empty house where he would be compelled to remain for several days. There were two courses open to him; either to submit quietly to a short imprisonment, or make an attempt to escape. If he chose the former alternative, his captor assured him, he should be well-treated, and as soon as possible be set free, uninjured either in purse or person. If he did not care to accept these terms, he must take his chance, and the speaker pointed grimly to a stout cudgel and a cruel-looking gag.

Vaughan, recognising the hopelessness of the situation, did not hesitate a moment, but cheerfully consented to the terms imposed, and gave his word of honour that he would not try in any way to escape or attract attention.

Vaughan's exit from this place was as mysterious as his entrance into it. One night the pair sat as usual playing cribbage, when Vaughan, after drinking a glass of liqueur, turned drowsy and stupid, and finally dropped into a heavy slumber. From that moment he recollected nothing until awaking in the prison. He denied most emphatically that he had gone to his own rooms on the Monday night, and expressed unbounded astonishment, when informed, of the jewel robbery at Hombage. His amazement was so genuine when he heard of his supposed visit there, that I felt almost compelled to believe in his innocence, though the explanation of his disappearance appeared so far-fetched and unnatural.

Questioned as to his acquaintance with Mervyn Hawke, he admitted knowing him, but the connection between them appeared to be only that of pigeon and rook, which I was willing enough to believe.

The whole affair had grown so complicated that I determined to run down and see Lord Kirtan, whom I readily persuaded to come at once to London. Like myself, he was completely mystified, though it was evident he grasped eagerly at the chance which Vaughan's story afforded of withdrawing from the prosecution.

Indeed, he admitted as much. "You see," he said, "the lad's father was an old friend of mine, and although I have been seen little of Glynn, it would go hard to condemn him to a felon's cell. Besides, you yourself advanced the opinion that no one but an accomplished thief could have effected the robbery."

After seeing Mervyn Hawke he became even more puzzled, and I realised that as a witness for the prosecution he would simply prove a broken reed.

Meanwhile the strictest investigation failed to produce any confirmation of the alleged abduction, which, seeing the material we had to work upon, was scarcely surprising.

Mervyn Hawke too, innocent or guilty, was quite safe from the law's clutches. His landlady's testimony would alone have sufficed to have secured his acquittal, but in addition to this, his friends, Fisher and Graves were perfectly prepared to swear to his movements during the Tuesday night and the whole of the following day.

The chief laughed heartily when I told him the story. "Of course," he said, "Mervyn Hawke stole the jewels, and has, by this time, safely disposed of them, but he has been too clever for you. Your own witnesses are against you. Vaughan's landlady cannot go back on what she has already testified; the Hombage party recognised her visitor as the real Simon Pure, and there is not a flaw in the alibi, so what are you to do?"

"But," I suggested, "what about the time? If the man was in his room at twenty minutes past four, how could he leave King's Cross at a quarter past?"

"Is there not such a thing as putting a clock forward," he asked, "and

casually directing an outsider's attention to the falsified time?" Curiously enough, this explanation, simple as it was, proved the true one. Five years had come and gone since the Hombage robbery. Mervyn Hawke was dead, and Mr. Vaughan had settled down into a respectable member of society, when I was sent to Manchester to receive a noted former named Graves, who turned out to be Mervyn Hawke's quondam friend.

"Well, Mr. Muir," he said cheerily, "I landed him into the train, 'you have got me at last; poor Mervyn always prophesied it, and unfortunately it would be of little use to put the clock on this time. Ah! poor fellow, he was worth a hundred of us.'"
