only describe as taking an advantage of the creditors here. The situation was, we believe, in a certain measure upprecedented, and the precedents which have now been established are certainly ones on which we cannot ook with any favour, nor do we think they will tend to facilitate the working of English banks in foreign countries. In Argentina and in Uruguay, so far as we could see, whilst a natural and proper preference was insured for the claims of local creditors, allowances were made for such differences as might exist between the local laws of liquidation and those of England. But in England no such allowance was made, and the assumption seems to have been acted on throughout that English law held equally good in Argentina and Uruguay and that it could override the local law-There does not seem to have been any attempt made to re-concile the differences or the conflicting interests raised by the peculiar situation of the Bank. And finally, when it was found that the Montevidean assets were not what they had been represented to be, and that the business here, despite the pretensions of the manager, was neither sound nor profitable, it was resolved to sacrifice the creditors here for the sake of saving the bus-

better case. The last is certainly the strangest part of the whole business, and to this day we entirely fail to understand on what legal or other pretext the Directors of the English Bank contrived to cut the Montevideo branch adrift and to accord its creditors in Uraguay less favorable treatment than that accorded its creditors in Argentina and in England. And even if the uncertainties of the law permit such a proceeding, its equity, we may even say its honesty, are still in question.

For all its division of residence, the business of the English Bank of the River Plate was one and indivisible, as indeed must be that of any bank. It was not a case of one Bank in Buenos Aires, another in Rosario, another in Montevideo and another in London. It was one and the same Bank in each of these places, and its creditors, wherever resident, were creditors of the English Bank as an entirety. The branches had a certain separat-ness, of necessity, as they were established in different countries and therefore subject to diterent laws, but they were not separate Banks. This is proved in

had an equal lien, to make a preferential payment to its creditors in

Argentina, and retuse to do the same for its creditors in Montevideo? It is rue that the local laws of each of these countries gave the local creditors a special lien on the local assets, by which nothing could be seperated from those local assets until the local creditors had been satisfied. But that special lien can not possibly be Leld to invalidate the general lien of the creditors on the general assets of the Bank, or, even it it did, it would invalidate the creditors in Argentina equally with those in Uruguay. The matter seems to us too plain to require argument. If the liquidators had power to separate money from the general assets for payment of ereditors in Argentins, they had equal power to do so for the creditors in Uruguay; if they could not do so for the creditors in Uruguay, as there was some pretence, they had no right to do so for shose in Argentina. But they do not seem to have made it a question of right or of fair treatment, but of convenience. It suited them to resume business in Argentina, but not in Urugoay, hence their invidious distinction. which we hope for the reputation of British banking honesty will not be allowed to stand as a precedent.

Let us take a parallel. Suppose the London and County Bauk, with its branches in half a hundred different county towns, were to go into liquidation. Would it be allowed to make preferential payments to creditors in the towns where business had been profitable, to the disadvantage of creditors in towns where busines had been unprofitable? Would such a course be allowed to any financial or commercial house with branches in different towns, or even in different states ? Certainly not, and any attempt at such preferential treatment would soon be qualified by some very hard words. The matter of resuming business in this or in that place is entirely one of choice, but as to settlement with the creditors there can be, in equity, no choice; they are all, wherever situated, creditors of the same concern, and entitled to equal treatment. When the shareholders of the English Bank were called upon to pay tue rest of the unpaid capital, they were told it was to meet the liabilities of the Bauk, not the liabilities in Argentina only, or in London, but the liabilities of the Bank as a whole. But the money derived from that call has not been applied to many different ways, apart from the liabilities of the Bank as a whole,

He missed his aim, and the bullet which he had intended for himself, struck and immediately killed the soldier next bim, named Pereyra. This is the official account of the affair. Why Diaz should have attempted so desperate an act for such a cause remains to be explained.

-From London telegrams we learn that the conservative papers are instigating the Government to annex Matabeleland, one of the richest regions of East Africa, at present sacrificed under an incompetent Government. They also express themselves as very dissatisfied with the arrangement in Siam, arguing that British interests have been sacrified by the inaction of Lord Rosebery, and that the French have gained a superior position .- The miners are returning to work in all parts,

WHY FOREIGNERS SHOULD PARTICIPATE IN POLITICS. (B. A. Herald)

The observations made by a respeoled contemporary on the neutrality of foreigners in politics and the armed participation of Santa Fé Colonisis in a revolutionary movement warrant a return to the sabject, although only yesterday we made a passing comment on the matter. There is much reason in the advice of the Standard that foreigners should remain neutral in politics, if

ing of the word and the scope of the subject or science. Politics consists of the science of Government. Who are interested in good government? The answer to this question will indicate the legitimate sphere of interest and influence in political discussion and consideration. We can conceive no greater interest on the part of an Argentine than of a foreignborn resident. The mere fact of a difference in birth-place in no way changes the interests which we have in the character and the conduct of the Government under which we live, Most of us were not consulted as to any preference we might have in a hirth-place; indeed, the latter fact was controlled by other volition than our own, even though we may fully acquiesce in the fact, but living as we do, native and foreign-born, under the same Government, laws and conditions, we have an equal interest that the aforesaid Government should be wise, strong, just and efficient. But it is urged that unnaturalized foreigners should not participate in politics and that in case one wishes to meddle therewith he should become naturalized. Undoubtedly, naturalization is the ideal policy for those who come here to make a new home, but those who are here for a term of years and hope to return to their native land at sometime, have, while here, an equal interest with Argentines in all that makes for good government. Even those who are here to remain but who do not care to sewer their relations to their native land have all the interests and all the rights of the Argentine with the exception of the voting franchise and its logical sequence, the eligibility for office. These latter are rights inherent in citizenship, while the discussion of politics is not. This difference is clearly maintained in the Constitution and the laws, and it is in harmony with facts and the fitness of things. Constitutional law does not pro-

hibit but specially recognizes, in the plainest of language, the equality of all residents in the Republic, and all the rights for which we contend both by the organic law and by international treaties made under the Constitution. Good taste does not require us to abstain from what the Constitution confers upon us, for no Argentine enjoys any right or privilege which does not rest upon the same authority. In squabbles for office, iu partisan-scheming, in scrambles for power, in conspiracies for the overthrow of Governments and parties by seditions means, the foreigner has no night to participate, but neither has the native-born Argentine, so that, whatever the analogies iollowed out, they bring us at last to the point that, with the exception of giving a vote or bolding an office, we have, whether born foreigners or Argentines, equal rights by the law of the Republic, by the rule of self and mutual interest, by the laws of good taste and the dictates of sound statesmanship. We make no apology for discussing all public questions as freely, as tully, and as boldly as it we had been born in this Republic. It is only fair to say that, with but few exceptions this view has been recognised by our Argentine colleagues, and they show no special respect for a foreign colony, man or paper that cares only for money-grubbing.

## LONDON NOTES

### FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 1.

In the House of Lords yesterday the question of betterment was again discussed, in connection with the London Improvement Bill. Lord Hobbouse moved that the view of their lordships against bettermen; should not be insisted upon, the other House having reinstated the provision in the Bill which the Committee had struck out in consequence of the resolution passed by the Lords. The motion was supported by Lord Monkswell, the Earl of Kimberley, and the Lord Chancellor, and was opposed by the Earlot Onslow, the Marquis of Salisbury, the Earl of Morley, and the Earl of Wemyss; and on a divission it was rejected by 50 to 27-23.

In the House of Commons, questions were put to the Under-Secretary for Foreign Aflairs with regard to Siam and the New Hebrides. In the course of replying on the former subject, Sir E. Grey said that there had been no withdrawal of the assurances given by France with respect to the independence of Siam, and that Lord Dufferin was returning to Paris this week to resume the negotiations on the lines previously agreed upon with the French Government, and stated in the House, as necessary to safeguard British interests. As to the New Hebrides, Sir E. Grey said that aunexation by France could not take place without the present convention being terminated; no notice had been given to terminate it, and her Majesty's Government had no information which would justify them in thinking that the French Government for a moment contemplated such a step. Mr. Gladstone gave notice of a reso-Intion to be moved on Monday with regard to the business of the House, and stated that the Government had determined at the close of Supply to
